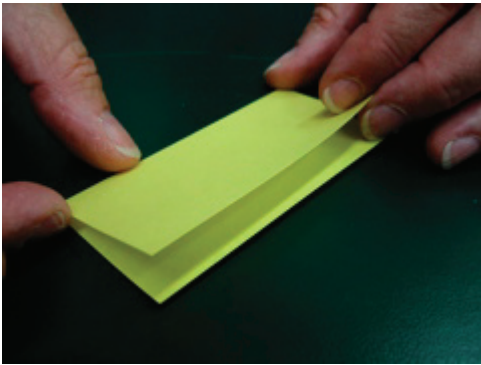


Three-Dimensional Ring

*Step-by-step directions by Marcia Bollwage
learned at a Teen Arts Festival in Mercer County, New Jersey*



Take one square of paper and fold it in half.



Crease to make a crisp fold.



On one side, fold the corners to make two triangles.

(note:

The closer the edges of the triangles are, the better.)



Here you can see the two triangles.



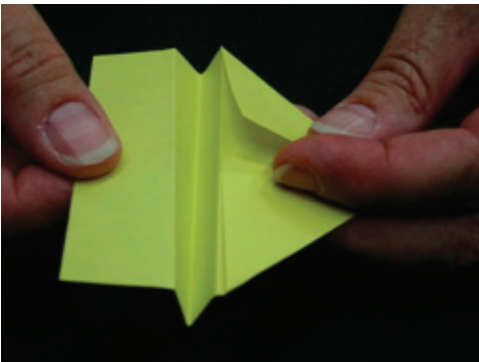
Fold the top half down to meet the bottom edge.

Crease to make a crisp fold.

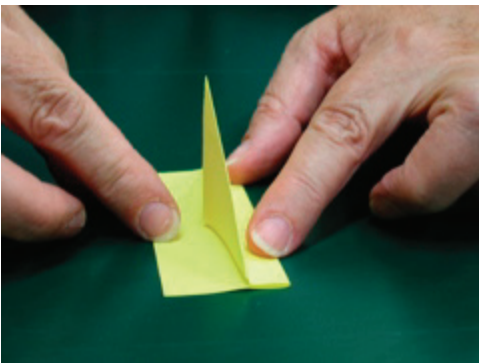
(note: next step is the only difficult fold)



Turn the paper over.



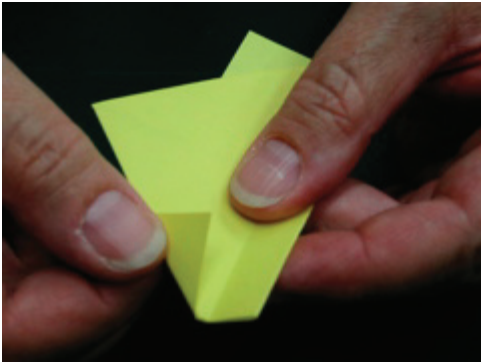
Put the paper on the table so that the two flaps of the triangles are facing up.



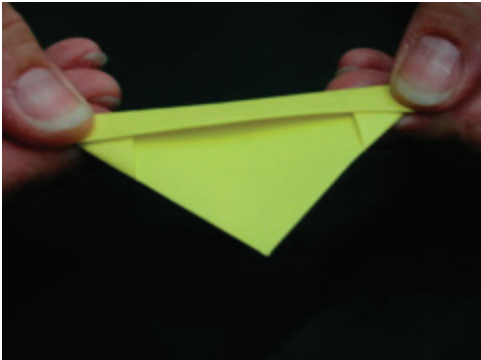
Bring the crease up to meet the edges of the two triangles which will crease the middle section.



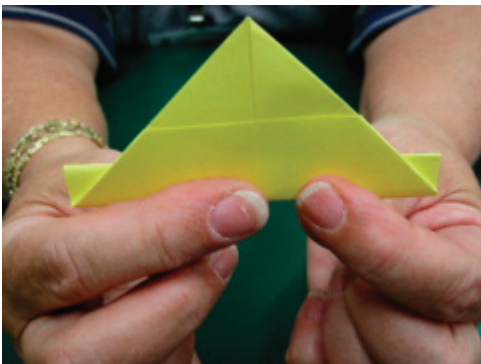
Fold the flap up.



Fold the small triangular flaps over on both sides.



Bring the middle section up over those flaps.



Turn it over so that you can see two small triangles on either end.

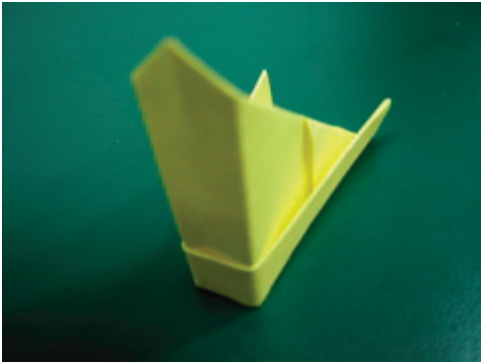


Bring the side so that there is a square with a diagonal showing on the end.

Crease to make a crisp fold.



Open up and repeat on the other side.



The finished piece will look like this.

Make 14 pieces. 14 different colors, 7 colors 2 of each is the recommended just because it's easier to find that amount of paper



To assemble, slide flaps into the pockets and continue until you have them all connected.



If you line up the colors in order it makes it easier to put together.



Here is the finished ring!
